In 1904 Michał Drzymała, Polish farmer, was forced to buy a house on wheels because the Prussian government did not allow him to build it on his land.

Fall was coming, and heating became the priority. Drzymała bought an old circus car which cost 350 marks. He manged to transport the car to the plot with nearby residents' help and notified the authorities about this fact.

However, he was ordered not to keep his car in one place for more than 24 hours. As a consequence, Michał was moving his car a bit further every day.

This way Drzymała became a hero, a symbol of the fight against the invader.
